2003 Alton Ochsner Award Relating Smoking and Health



The Selection Committee of the Alton Ochsner Award Relating Smoking and Health is pleased to announce that John R. Hughes, MD, Professor of Psychiatry, Psychology, and Family Practice at the University of Vermont, has been selected to receive its 18th Annual Award. In addition to his internationally recognized work as a sci-

entist, educator, and clinician, Dr. Hughes is the Co-Founder and Past President of the Society for Research on Nicotine and Tobacco.

Dr. Hughes was the primary figure involved in the development of rigorous criteria to characterize the disorders of nicotine dependence and withdrawal. These criteria now serve as the standard psychiatric and medical diagnostic tools for both research and clinical care. His work was the first to demonstrate the prolonged nature of nicotine withdrawal as the major obstacle to successful smoking cessation. In addition, he has been a leader in developing pharmacologic and behavioral approaches to facilitate cessation in patients previously unable to quit smoking. Importantly, research by Dr. Hughes revealed the ways in which nicotine dependence co-occurs with other substance abuse and psychiatric disorders. Most recently he served as the principal author of the treatment guidelines for patients with nicotine dependence developed by the American Psychiatric Association.

Supported by the Ochsner Clinic Foundation, the Alton Ochsner Award recognizes exemplary scientific achievements that provide major insights into biological mechanisms that relate tobacco consumption and human disease. Dr. Hughes will receive a \$15,000 cash award, a special medallion and a scroll to be presented at the Annual Convocation of the American College of Chest Physicians during its scientific sessions to be held in Orlando on Sunday, October 26, 2003.
